  - Dade Co has 135 schools with school gardens
    - make sure teaching healthy eating along with gardening/science
    - expanding joint use agreements/nutritional ed in afterschool care
    - how school gardens can be maintained and sustained over time
- Partner with the science center for gardens/healthy eating; bringing local healthy food to families; physical activity into daily routine
  - FRESH PRODUCE Sustainable Living Project: Will/David
    - expanding prgm; all food going to emer feeding in downtown
      Tampa to gage impact
      - trying to cut their food budget in half to measure impact of giving
    - second phase aquaponics: beginning to write proposal
    - Will: taking classes to learn how to's re: aquaponics
    - must sustain itself financially in order to get funding for phase 3 (fruit trees)
    - trial and errors with new projects; what works what needs to be fixed
    - so far project successful; more partners = more produce = more impact
    - wish list is growing; need bobcat
    - turning into food outlet; ppl want it to do more; great location for exposure
    - TBH and Whitwam organics partnering with SUAC to help

## maintain gardens

- some gardens losing steam; Master gardeners hoping to get SUAC to help with middle management
  - working with middle management more important than finding a gardener
  - finding model where easy for someone to take ownership and

## MAINTAIN ownership

- calculating retail value of what gardens are producing to determine impact
  - David Whitwam helping Univ Comm Center start their community garden and set up community market
  - Gardens have helped individuals and agencies network
- DISTRIBUTION Feeding America and RCS: Sylvia/Jerry
  - Sylvia go into how donations going from shelf stable to fresh produce; problems associated with change
  - Jerry show impact of nutrient dense produce in community vs. amount of produce
  - helping distribute produce from FA TB into Pinellas
- CH HUNGER Mary Kate/Christina Sudduth
  - Mary Kate: Schools do 27 million free/reduce meals go over general overview of fresh produce grants, etc.
  - only schools with 90% need, eligible for grant
  - go into details...
- SENIOR HUNGER: Jason Martino/Steve King
  - bring awareness to hunger in senior pop
  - give good illustration of what that means
  - congregate sites vs delivery prgm meals and future goals
  - talk about cuts due to sequestration
  - FL Council on Aging (FCOA)

- RCS: highlights population receiving emer food changing: increase in clients earning \$30-40k/year
- Dan: each committee should have a "what a successful story looks like... 5 yrs from now"

    - RCS: has been distributing fresh produce; working with 13 diff sites/agencies to distribute that produce
    - Shephard Center: extended pantry hours as result of map; taking truck to sites to make visits hadn't done before
    - RCS: find food deserts in areas to approve USDA meal sites/subsites
